

3. The meeting commenced with recitation of few verses from the holy Qur'an. Prof. Sarosh H. Lodi, Chairman CIEC, welcomed all the members of CIEC and presented the agendas for further discussion as given under:

**Agenda Item:1 Revised Manual for Charter Inspection and Evaluation of Higher Education Institutions in Sindh (Revised in 2025)**

The Chairman CIEC briefed about the revised Manual / Guidelines for Charter, inspection and evaluation of Universities / Degree Awarding Institutes in Sindh which were approved by Sindh Higher Education Commission, in its 28<sup>th</sup> meeting held on 23<sup>rd</sup> July 2025. He Further gave a detailed presentation regarding the approved manual/ guidelines including the procedures for charter, inspection and evaluation of higher education institutions (HEIs), constitution and functions of CIEC, types of visits,

constitution of visiting teams and their trainings, criteria for establishment of new Universities/DAI, procedures for inspection of the HEIs etc.

Engr. Sohail Bashir asked about training program for the Monitoring and Inspections Teams. He also asked about the procedure / scope of the inspection team that weather it shall conduct inspection at University / Institute Level or programs Level.

In response, the Chairman CIEC briefed that orientation - workshops are already scheduled in the month of September and October 2025 in various regions of Sindh in which different participants from the Universities / Institutions, CIEC Secretariat etc. shall be participate. Moreover, previously CIEC – Sindh HEC has also conducted training programs for programme evaluators / subject experts which shall also be extended in future. The Chairman further explained that the inspection teams shall be conducting the inspections of the University / Institute, its departments and the programs being offered in the departments for which various monitoring forms have been designed such as M-1 for general data of the Institution, M-2 for departmental data, M-3 for Research and QEC, M-4 for students' feedback.

Ms. Nadra Panjwani, inquired about the actions taken by Sindh HEC / CIEC against those institutions which do not meet the criteria/ standards. The Chairman CIEC briefed that Sindh HEC/ CIEC has authority to stop admissions in such Institutions and it may recommend the Government for withdrawal of Charter of the concerned University/ Institute.

Prof. Dr. A.Q Mughal and Ar. Tahira Adia Fazali suggested to introduce a suitable mechanism for collecting data from the institutions which is being collected by different regulatory bodies, in order to remove the difficulties being faced by the universities to submit the huge data in due course of time.

The Chairman CIEC briefed that the MEG Forms through which the data was collected in previous rounds, have been revised and specified. However, other regulatory bodies are functioning in their own domain and jurisdiction, no mechanism is available through which centralized data may be collected for ease of universities/ institutions. Mr. Moinuddin Siddiqui Secretary Sindh HEC further briefed about the proceedings and steps taken for harmonization of Sindh HEC with HEC and told that Sindh HEC/ CIEC are working on it, specifically for the joint visits with the other regulatory bodies, including HEC, in compliance to the guidelines of Council of Common Interest which have already been circulated among the federal and provincial regulatory bodies.

Engr. Nazeer Hussain made query regarding inclusion of NGO in the legal requirements (section 4.3 of the Manual) as sponsoring body. He further suggested that the requirements mentioned in the section 4.5 of the Manual, should not be less than the requirements of HEC. He further asked about the working on the models PREE, PGPR as incorporated in the Manual.



In response, the Chairman explained that NGO or any other entity such as company, foundation, trust, society etc. shall be considered the sponsoring body of the proposed university/ institute only, if it is registered under the Society Registration Act/ Companies Ordinance with a valid registration certificate.


The Chairman further briefed that the requirements for establishment of proposed institutions of various types is deliberately framed in a harmonized design in which conflict may raise with the requirements of other regulatory bodies specifically HEC. Mr. Nazeer Hussain emphasized that NGO is not accepted by HEC for issuance of NOC for grant of charter as per the Cabinet criteria. Pertaining to the query about working on the PREE/ PGPR models, the Chairman informed that working has already been done and shall be followed as per the Manual.

**Resolution#1: The members appreciated and acknowledged the revised Manual/ Guidelines. Members further recommended deletion of NGO in the Manual / Guidelines (Section 4.3, 4.3-a-ii , CIEC Form-02, 03, 04 and 07)**

**Agenda Item#2: Grant of Charter to Sindh Institute of Teacher Education (submitted by College Education Department, Government of Sindh)**

Prof. Dr. Sarosh H. Lodi, Chairman CIEC briefed the CIEC members regarding the case of up-gradation of Government College of Education, FB Area, Karachi, to the status of institute, whose case was forwarded by College Education Department Government of Sindh, vide letter No.SO(ACD-I)/CED/Feasibility-Report 2024, dated 20<sup>th</sup> November 2024. He further informed that on-site inspections of the proposed Institute were conducted by CIEC on 9<sup>th</sup> December 2024 and on 14<sup>th</sup> February, 2025 and based on recommendations, the Grant of Charter for upgradation of the Government College as Sindh Institute of Teachers Education, Karachi (as public sector institute), subject to fulfilment of conditions such as Faculty appointment, Modalities of funding, IT-Infrastructure development etc. has been approved by the Sindh Higher Education Commission in its 27<sup>th</sup> Meeting held on 26<sup>th</sup> May-2025. In this regard, its draft bill was provided at to the members for perusal, discussion and recommendations.

Prof. Dr. Abdul Qadeer Khan Rajput, Prof. Dr. A.Q Mughal, and other members pointed out various ambiguities in the bill with respect to appointment of Executive Director, statutes, dual roles./ overlapping of powers and functions, finance & planning Committee, Selection Board, etc. Prof. Dr. Abdul Qadeer Khan Rajput, Prof. Dr. A.Q Mughal and Mr. Moinuddin Siddiqui proposed a few amendments in the Act, which were endorsed unanimously by the Committee. Prof. Dr. Sohail Bashir further suggested that model bills for both private and public sector Universities should be made available for proposed institutions in future.



**Resolution#2: The proposed amendments submitted by several members were incorporated as per the Annexure-I, for processing of the draft bill as per the decision of the Sindh Higher Education Commission.**

**Agenda Item:3 Application/ Proposal received for Grant of Charter to Coast Guard University, Karachi.**

The Chairman CIEC briefed that application along with feasibility report is received from Coast Guard Pakistan with request for grant of Charter to proposed Coast Guard University (as a private sector University). For last 02 years, the representatives have been asked to revise the feasibility report for the proposed University, in order to provide the missing documents and remove ambiguities, which have been revised several times and submitted to CIEC for further processing. He further presented the time-line and details of the correspondence regarding the proposed University. He further asked the members to review the summary and the details regarding fulfillment of the criteria by the proposed University, which were already provided to them and to submit their comments if any.

Prof. Dr. A.Q Mughal suggested that proposed sponsors of University should give a brief justification regarding the purpose and need for establishment of the University, their objectives, and scope of the programs which should also be reviewed.

Prof. Dr. Amjad Siraj Memon pointed out that previously various universities have been established with specified objective/ field but these institutions have now introduced various programmes which are not supposed to be in their relevant field, such as BS-IT in a well-known university of medical field.

The members further discussed and showed their concern about the proposed University which is sponsored by a federal organization and utilization of government land, resources etc. for the proposed university in a private sector to be chartered by Government of Sindh.

**Resolution#3: It was unanimously resolved that the Sindh Higher Education Commission may be requested to ask the Law & Parliamentary Affairs Department Government of Sindh, that:**

- 1) Whether, a private sector university can be sponsored by a federal organization which in this case is Pakistan Coast Guard.
- 2) Can Government of Sindh grant charter to a University proposed by federal organization?
- 3) Whether, such private institution may utilize the land which is in name of the federal organization (Pakistan Coast Guard)?



- 4) Whether, a private institution can use the name of a federal organization e.g. Coast Guard University (Pakistan Coast Guard) ?

**Agenda Item#4: Applications received for obtaining NoC to commence new programs in Public and Private Sector Institutions in Sindh.**

The Chairman CIEC gave a presentation regarding the applications of various public sector Institutions received for commencement of new programmes, as given under:

- I) Request for NOC regarding the commencement of Evening sessions/Classes of Ph.D, MBA, BBA, and BS Criminology at Shaheed Zulifqar Ali Bhutto University of Law, Karachi.
- II) Request for NOC to establish following departments at Shaheed Benazir Bhutto University, Shaheed Benazirabad:
  - a. Department of Physics & Electronics.
  - b. Department of Botany
  - c. Department of Mathematics.
  - d. Department of Geo Informatics.
  - e. Program of Artificial Intelligence.
  - f. Program of Cyber Security.

Prof. Dr. Amjad Siraj Memon, further asked that whether issuance of NoC for new programs should be the mandate of federal HEC or not, as the degrees for the programs shall be verified by the Federal HEC.

In response, Prof. Dr. Tariq Rafi and Mr. Moinuddin Siddiqui, briefed that previously universities have been establishing new departments / commencing new programs without intimation, without fulfilling the basic requirements, which resulted a huge financial impact specifically for the Universities whose budget is already in deficit. Hence, a summary was approved by the Chief Minister Sindh and his directives have been forwarded to all the Universities regarding prior approval before commencement of new programs, establishment of new departments or a new campus. Moreover, the Institutions, to whom NoC shall be issued by Sindh HEC, shall also be liable to obtain NoC from Federal HEC.

In this regard, the Chairman further briefed that there is no approved policy/ criteria in CIEC, Sindh HEC to review the cases of establishment of a new department(s) or to commence new degree program(s). In the regard, criteria/ parameters, such as academic infrastructure, availability of faculty, physical infrastructure, financial viability, financial impact (specifically for public sector HEIs), legal framework/ approvals by the statutory bodies, scope of the programs/employability etc., along with justification(s), needs to be laid down for further processing of the cases.



In this regard, he presented a draft proposal regarding criteria, requirements for commencement of new departments / programs, which were discussed at length.

**Resolution#4: It was unanimously resolved that a "Department Review Committee" be constituted consisting of members, Prof. Dr. Noman Ahmed (Convener), Engr. Niaz Hussain and Mr. Itrat Rizvi, for further finalizing the draft regarding the criteria to be fulfilled by the Institutions for commencement of new programme(s), establishment of new department(s) for further implementation and processing, accordingly.**


**Agenda Item#5: Applications received for obtaining NoC for new campuses of already chartered private sector institutions in Sindh.**

The Chairman gave a presentation regarding the applications for NOC, received from Karachi Institute of Economics & Technology, Karachi for its Ahsanaabad Campus and Iqra University Karachi for its campus at Hyderabad and Gulshan, Karachi, whose summaries and details were already shared with the members.

Regarding the request for NOC from Karachi Institute of Economics & Technology, Karachi for its Ahsanaabad Campus, the Chairman CIEC elaborated that the Institute has to shift his present candidate from Main Campus to the proposed Campus to vacant its present campus. The institute fulfills the minimum criteria except the land which should be at least 3.33 acres. In this regard, the members suggested that the HEC criteria be also reviewed and if the institute fulfills HEC criteria its case may further be proceed. In other case, after fulfilment all the procedures, the institution may also be given a conditional NoC for only present enrolled students, subject to not enroll students in new intake until the fulfillment of required criteria.

Regarding the request for NOC from Iqra University for its campus at Hyderabad and Gulshan, the Chairman CIEC briefed about the criteria fulfilled by the proposed campuses. The members further pointed out that the University has already commenced academic activities in the campuses and students have also been enrolled in the both campuses without obtaining prior approval/ NoC from Sindh HEC, for which the University should be asked to explain the position for such violation.

Moreover, Prof. Dr. S.M. Tariq Rafi and Mr. Moinuddin Siddiqui briefed that as per the decision of Council of Common Interest, the Federal HEC have to conduct a joint visit for issuance of NOC to any institutions. Whereas, Sindh HEC has being inviting nominees of Federal HEC since from the beginning and they have participated in various inspections of private and public sector institutes. But unfortunately Federal HEC has not conduct any joint visit as per the aforementioned decision of CCI.



**Resolution#5(a):** Pertaining to the request for NOC from Karachi Institute of Economics & Technology, Karachi for its Ahsanabad Campus, it was resolved that HEC criteria be reviewed and if the institute fulfills HEC criteria, its case may further be processed, accordingly. In other case, after fulfilment all the procedures, the institution may also be given a conditional NoC, for only present enrolled students, subject to not enroll students in new intake until fulfillment of the required criteria.


**Resolution#5(b):** Regarding the request for NOC from Iqra University for its campus at Hyderabad and Gulshan, it was unanimously resolved that as Iqra University has already commenced academic activities in the campuses and students have also been enrolled in the both campuses without obtaining prior approval/ NoC from Sindh HEC, the University should be asked to explain the position for such violation and illegal activity, along with a ban on the new intake in both campuses until the issuance of NoC from Sindh HEC.

**Agenda Item#6: Applications received for obtaining NoC to operate under foreign collaboration.**

The Chairman briefed about the application received from International Centre of Excellence (ICE), Karachi for issuance of NOC to the institution to operate under collaboration with the different foreign universities/ institutions. The summary and details as per the feasibility of the concerned proposed institution, already forwarded to the members, was discussed at length.

The Chairman further briefed that the institution intends to operate under collaboration with 03 foreign institutions, in which various ambiguities have been found in accordance with the HEC Transnational Education Policy (TNE)-2024, such as no agreement with the foreign institutions have been found, one of the foreign institute is just a training center, legal status of the foreign institutions is not clear, uncertainty about the Types of the Institute for which it is applying for etc. One of the member highlighted that foreign education is exclusively federal subject under the constitution of Pakistan and Federal Govt. (HEC) NOC suffices for the purpose. The Chairman CIEC agreed that though it is federal subject but the CIEC intends to ensure the quality of such institutions and to verify criteria to be fulfilled by such institutions before issuance them NOC in the jurisdiction of the province.

**Resolution#6:** It was resolved that the HEC Transnational Education Policy (TNE)-2024 be adopted to scrutinize and process the cases



pertaining to foreign collaboration and the concerned institute (ICE) be asked to fulfill the criteria, accordingly.

**Agenda Item#7: Budget (Revenue and Expenditure) of CIEC**

The Chairman CIEC briefed that the exercise of the 10<sup>th</sup> Round of Inspections, monitoring and evaluation of the Public & Private Sector Institutions, expenditure in various heads is to be incurred for which he presented its proposed budget, for further perusal and approval accordingly.

**Resolution#7: The Budget (Revenue and Expenditure) of CIEC for 10<sup>th</sup> Round of Inspections, was approved by the members of the Committee.**

**Agenda Item#8: Future strategies of non-functioning Institutions**

The Chairman CIEC briefed the status of non-operational institutes (in which no academic activities are being operated) which was also presented in the 28<sup>th</sup> meeting of Sindh HEC, in which the commission, directed CIEC to issue the Show-Cause Notices to such Universities / Institutions, as given under:





- (iv) A final public notice be published in leading newspapers against the institutions: Qalandar Shahbaz University of Modern Sciences, Tando Muhammad Khan, Mohtarma Fatima Jinnah University Hyderabad, Moulana Abdul Sattar Edhi University, Karachi, Etihad University, Karachi, Pakistan University, Karachi, City University, Karachi, Karachi Institute of Technology and Entrepreneurship, Karachi, with an alert / show-cause Notice to submit the report in order to



function as per their act, failing which withdrawal of their charter shall be recommended to the Government of Sindh. :


- (v) Status of the above institution shall be submitted in the next meeting of CIEC.


**Agenda Item#9: Schedule for inspection of Private & public Sector Universities in Sindh for 10th Round of Visits**
